Andrew Forsythe, bass, is originally from southeast Michigan. Most recently, he sang **Pistola** in Indiana University Opera Theater's production of *Falstaff* in the 2021 season. He also appeared as **Marquis D'Obigny** in *La Traviata* and in the choruses for *Parsifal* and *Die Zauberflöte* with IU Opera Theater. Forsythe was a finalist in the 2021 Metropolitan Laffont Competition in the Illinois District and is a recipient of an Encouragement Award in the 2020 Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions in the Houston District. With Oakland University Opera Theatre, Forsythe appeared as **Frank Maurrant** in *Street Scene*, **Plunkett** in *Martha*, and **Sarastro** in *Die Zauberflöte*. Forsythe was the substitute/rehearsal bass soloist for Verdi's *Requiem* and Beethoven's *Symphony No. 9* with the Oakland Symphony Orchestra He completed his Master of Music degree in Voice Performance at Indiana University in 2021 and is currently pursuing a Performer Diploma under the tutelage of Timothy Noble. At IU, Forsythe serves as a Graduate Assistant for the Voice Department Office. He is a graduate of Oakland University in Rochester, Michigan where he studied with John Paul White.

Daixuan Ai is a composer and pianist currently pursuing a master's degree in Music Composition at Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, where she studies Composition with Don Freund and David Dzubay and piano with Emile Naoumoff. She is also teaching music theory as an assistant instructor. She graduated from Baldwin Wallace University with a bachelor's degree in Composition. There, she studied composition with Clint Needham and piano with Sungeun Kim. Daixuan has been studying harmony, counterpoint, and music analysis at the European American Musical Alliance Institute since 2019, and she is a student of the program founder, Philip Lasser. In summer 2022, Daixuan will be attending Aspen Music Festival for Composition with full scholarship, and she will study with Christopher Theofanidis and Stephen Hartke. Daixuan's works have been performed by various ensembles and performers including Hub New Music, Cleveland Chamber Symphony, Baldwin Wallace Symphonic Orchestra, Baldwin Wallace Symphonic Wind Ensemble, 5th House Ensemble, the Cleveland Orchestra trumpeter Jack Sutte, pianist Jihye Chang, and BW faculty Sungeun Kim and Barton Rotberg. The upcoming performances of Daixuan's music include a trio piece commissioned by CityMusic Cleveland, and a master's composition recital at Indiana University.
